Journey of Inner Wheel in India







Inner Wheel movement started on 10th January 1924 when the first Inner Wheel Club was formed in Manchester in 1924. It took 31 years for Inner Wheel to come to India with the first club being born in Ahmedabad 4th February 1955. Late Mrs. Minne Rustom Camma was the first President of the club. She flew to Scarborough and brought the charter of this club. From 1955 to 1964 clubs grew to 27 in number.

In 1965, with such big number of clubs, the first District– numbered District 75 was formed. The founder clubs of IWD 75 were Ahmedabad, Anand, Porbandar, Surat, Bardoli, Nadiad, Navsari, Palanpur and Bulsar. It is the oldest District in the country. The District was formed at Ahmedabad under the guidance of Late Mrs. Dorothy Hitching, the then President of the Association of Inner Wheel Clubs of Great Britain. Mrs. Asma Mascati of Inner Wheel Club of Surat, District 305 (now presently in District 306) was the first District Chairman of the first IWD in India for the year 1965-66. She later became the 5th IIW Prepresentative from India. Mrs Dorothy Hitching also graced the occasion with her inspiring presence.

The second District, District 315, in South was formed in 1966 with 15 clubs covering far flung areas of South & North Andhra Pradesh and Mumbai with Founder Chairman Mrs. Parviz Home Banajee of Mumbai.

In the very next year, in 1967-68 District 317 (South) was started which took birth in Old Mysore with Mrs. Malathi Ramakrishnan Rao from Bangalore (now in District 319) as the founder Chairman. She was the 3rd IIW Representaive from India. District 317 (South) was formed comprising IWC Bangalore, Bangalore North, Bangalore South, Shimoga, Sakaleshpur and Mysore. Later on, IWC Tumkur and Hassan joined the District within



a few months. It is the third District formed in India which later got bifurcated into Districts 317, 318 and 319.

North was not left far behind. The fourth District of India was District 310 which was formed on 5th December 1968 by then IIW President Mrs. L. Weightman. Mrs. Meher Framjee of Agra (that time in District 310 and now in District 311) became the founder Chairman. Later on she became 4th IIW Representative from India for 2 consecutive years – 1972-73 and 1973-74. The first club of that District, Inner Wheel Club of Muzaffarnagar (club at the time of Undistricted India) was born in 1967 and attached directly to Association of Inner Wheel Clubs in Great Britain and Ireland. Meerut Club, the first club once the District was formed was made in 1969.

District 75 expanded. More and more Inner Wheel Clubs were formed comprising Gujarat, Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh and the district was later on numbered as District 305 in 1968.

1955 onwards to 1968 was a period when efforts were made to give India place of importance on the International Inner Wheel map and finally India was given the privilege of having a National Council of Inner Wheel Clubs in India and Sri Lanka. Since the clubs in India had increased, it was a necessary step that a National Council would look after the working of the clubs in India and Sri Lanka and its head would be known as International Inner Wheel Representative – IIWR.

In 1968, when the National Council was formed, Dr. (Mrs.) Malati Rana of Navsari of District then 305 and now presently in District 306, Gujarat became the first IIWR. She held this office for two years–1968-69 and 1969-1970. Till 1976-77 five more IIW Representatives were appointed.

1970-71 witnessed the formation of the fifth District in India – District 320 in 1970-71 down South. District 320 was spread over two countries – India and Sri Lanka and two states of India – Tamil Nadu and Kerala. The Inner Wheel District 320 was inaugurated at the District Assembly held at Trivandrum in 1970 by then IIW Representative Dr. Malati Rana. Mrs. Seetha Rajamony of Inner Wheel Club of Trivandrum took over as the first District Chairman. This District had clubs formed way back in 1960 onwards – Inner Wheel Club of Trivandrum was the first club in District



320 inaugurated in June 1960, followed by the Inner Wheel Club of Madras South (1963). These Clubs did not belong to any District but belonged to the National Council of Inner Wheel in India. 1966-70 saw the springing up of many clubs in the South. Colombo (1965), Calicut (1966), Madras (1966), Palghat (1968), Quilon (1967), Ranipet (1968), Alleppey (1970), Cochin West (1970), Cannanore (1970), Trichur(1970), Cochin (1971). This initiated the action of forming District 320.

Within 5 years of formation of District 305, in 1970 District 305 was further reorganized into 2 districts- District 305 and District 306. As a result District 306 came into existence in 1970 with 14 clubs. It included clubs from South Gujarat, Central Gujarat, Saurashtra and Madhya Pradesh. Mrs. Shardaben Pillai on Inner Wheel Club Bharuch became the first Chairman of District 306.

One more District, District 314, was formed in Western India in the Inner Wheel year 1970-71 from District 315. Mrs. Silla Ardhesir was the Founder Chairman who popularized the reading of the Inner Wheel Prayer at every Inner Wheel meeting and function in India. She was also CCC Chairman for $1^{\rm st}$ and $3^{\rm rd}$ Triennial Conference held in 1977 in Mumbai and 1983 in Trivandrum respectively.

1971 saw District 311 came into existence with the bifurcation of District 310 with Mrs. Sharda Bhargava of Varanasi as Founder Chairman and Deputy National Council member who became Association President of Association of Inner Wheel Clubs in India and Sri Lanka in the year 1977-78. In District 311, IWC Aligarh was the oldest club and IWC Allahabad the largest.

In 1974 two Districts were formed: District 317 and District 321.

Earlier, in 1968, District 317 (South) was formed. Many more clubs – Sirsi, Hubli, Hospet, Raichur, Punjim and Bellary Clubs were formed. In 1974 all these Clubs were joined to form the new Inner wheel District 317. Mrs. Kamala Iyengar from IWC Hubli took initiative in bringing all the Clubs together and formed new Inner wheel District 317 and Mrs. Kamala Iyengar donned the chair of Founder Chairman. Inner Wheel Club of



Sangli in the District was the first Club to be formed on 30th May 1967. It was known as non-Districted Club.

In the same year of formation of District 317, Inner Wheel District 321 was formed from District 320 with late Mrs. Lucille Amarasurya from Sri Lanka as the first chairman.

For Inner Wheel year 1975-76 Mrs. Nagamani Chandrashekhar took over as the last IIWR because in 1976 we were honoured to have our Association of Inner Wheel Clubs in India and Sri Lanka who's first President was Mrs. Rakshaben Mehta from District 314. In the same year, in 1976-77, the 1st Association Conference (now called Triennial Conference) was held in Mumbai in 1977. The Association Bye-laws were framed by Mrs. Parviz Home Banajee (founder Chairman of District 315), Mrs. Silla Ardeshir (founder Chairman of District 314) and Association President Raksha Mehta. Since then we have being having Triennial Conference every three years.

In 1977-78, District 310 was bifurcated into 310 and 309. Mrs. Minna Kapur, later to be the 1st IIW President from India took over a 1st Chairman of District 309.

Inner Wheel year 1977-78 also saw the advent of four more Districts – District 318 and District 319 in South carved out of District 317 (South) and District 329 in East. District 318 was formed with Mrs. Mohana Chakrapani from Bangalore (now in District 319) as the founder Chairman and IW District 319 started with Mrs. Anusuya Venson also from Bangalore was the first Chairman. The existence of District 317 (South) came to an end.

1977-78 also saw the formation of District 329 with Mrs. Aarti Srimal as first District Chairman. Inner Wheel movement started in the eastern zone in the year 1961 with the formation of IWC South West Calcutta under the leadership of founder President Late Mrs. Arati Dutta and founder Secretary Mrs. Roja Bradney. In 1977 District 329 was formed under the leadership of Association President Mrs. Raksha Mehta in 1977 with 4 clubs- South West Calcutta, South Calcutta, Darjeeling and Guwahati.



In year 1983-84 Bangladesh joined the Association and separated after a year.

1984-85 saw the formation of District 312 due to bifurcation from District 311. Founder Chairman of the District was Mrs. Prabha Bajpai.

1985-86 of Inner Wheel also witnessed formation of 9 more Districts – 301, 308 from District 309 and 310 and 307 from District 309 in North; District 304 in Central India and District 313 in West; Districts 325 and 326 in East and District 316 and 323 in South. Another significant development was that Sri Lanka was bifurcated from India's District 321 and an independent District 322 was formed comprising of all clubs in Sri Lanka. Thus, Association of Inner Wheel Clubs in India and Sri Lanka was now called Association of Inner Wheel Clubs in India.

District 310 once again bifurcated and District 301 was formed. Mrs. Anita Aggawal, who later became the 2nd IIW President from India was the founder Chairman.

District 307 was carved out of District 309. Founder Chairman of the District was Mrs. Chander Prabha Gandhi of Phagwara Club was the founder Chairman.

District 308 came into existence on July 1985 as a result of the bifurcation and reconstruction of Districts 309 and 310. Mrs Nira Nath, from Ambala became the founder Chairman of District 308.

In the same year District 304 was formed in mostly out of District 306 with 7 clubs – Bhopal, Indore, Khandwa, Indore Central, Mandsour, Itarsi and Godra. Dr. Shyam Verma of Indore was the founder Chairman.

In west, clubs from District 314 and 317 were bifurcated with 7 clubs of District 314 and 2 clubs of District 317 to form a new District District 313. PAP Mrs. Charu Chinchankar of IWC Poona was the founder Chairman.

With Dr. Saraswati Devi from Biharsharif, as founder Chairman, District 325 was also formed in 1985 with four clubs – Darbhanga, Biharsharif, Hazaribagh and Gaya.



District 315 included Andhra Pradesh, Orissa and Madya Pradesh and the vastness of area created operational problems. With Mrs. Lalita Jain from Raipur as founder Chairman, District 326, which was earlier a part of District 315, came into existence to ease governance in 1985-86. IWC of Raipur chartered in 1972 is the first club in the District followed by Cuttack, Baripada and Jagdalpur in 1982.

Down south District 316 was carved out of District 318 and thus few Andhra and few Karnataka clubs were in that District. The founder Chairman was from Bellary, Mrs. Indira Dhar.

Another District in the South which came into existence is District 323 with Mrs. Kalaimagal Swaminathan of Vellore as Founder Chairman. It came into being as a break away from District 320 with its geographical boundaries covering all of Tamil Nadu and parts of Kerala. Inner Wheel Club of Madras South, the first club formed in South India, belongs to IIW District 323, thus giving us the distinction of being the District where the Inner Wheel movement was first started in South India. It is in fact the second club to be formed in India, after Inner Wheel Club of Ahmedabad.

In year 1991-92 District 314 once again was bifurcated and District 303 was born with Dr. Trupta Davalbhakta, IWC Jalgaon, as Founder Chairman. Inner Wheel District 303 was formed with 13 clubs with Nasik District, Jalgaon District and Vidarbha region of Maharashtra.

The very next year in in 1992-93 District 329 too bifurcated and District 324 and 328 (Bangladesh) were formed. Mrs. Purabi Roy from Asansol was the Founder Chairman of District 324. District 315 too once again got bifurcated and Inner Wheel District 302 came into existence on 1st July, 1992. Founder Chairman of the District was Mrs. Kamala Viswanath of Vijayawada.

In 10 years after formation of District 323, it got bifurcated into District 323 and 298 and thus District 298 was formed in 1995 with Mrs. Shymala Venkataramanan as first District Chairman. She belong to IWC Mayiladhuthuria.



Inner Wheel is an organization we love. I am very proud to say that we have the largest number of clubs and members in the world. We are world number 1 in Inner Wheel world.

Dr. Malati Rana

She was the first IIW Representative from Navasari (earlier in District 305 and now in 306) for two years– 1968-69 and 1969-70. Dr. Dipika of Ahmedabad, again from District 305, became the IIWR in 1970-71. She continued the efforts to give a strong foundation to Inner Wheel.



Malathi Ramkrishna Rao

3rd IIW Representative from Bangalore (earlier District 317 (S) then in 318 and now 319) in 1971-72, Mrs. Malathi R. Rao was also 1st District Chairman of District 317 (S) in 1967-68. She was a firm disciplinarian and many of us have very fond memories of her leadership.





Meher N. Framjee

The 4th IIW Representative was Mrs. Meher Framjee from Agra (earlier in District 310 and now in 311) for 2 years in 1972-73 and 1973-74. Meher was a very petite, graceful and wonderful leader who lived in Agra physically, but actually lived in the hearts of all with her immense charm and rapport with so many of us. She later moved to Mumbai, District 314. A 'Role Model' to most of us, she was extremely active and was seen at most of the Triennial Conferences.



Asma Mascati

5th IIW Representative from Surat (earlier District 305 and now in 306) in 1974-75, was also 1st District Chairman of 1st District of India District 305. Mrs. Mascati, first District Chairman of 1st District 75 (now 305) from Surat had a very quiet and sober personality and was extremely talented and versatile.



Nagmani Chandrashekhar

Mrs. Chandrashekhar was the 6th and last IIW Representative from Bangalore (earlier District 317 (S) then in 318 and now 306) in 1975-76) She was District Chairman of then District 317 (South) in 1972-73. She hailed from Bangalore and looked after the National Council in its final phase as later we had Association of Inner Wheel Clubs in India. She is the only IIWR alive.

1976-77 Association President Raksha Mehta (District 314)

The first Inner Wheel member from India to be a recipient of Margarette Golding Award, highest award in IIW joined as member of IWC Thane to become the District Chairman in 1971-72. Later she shifted to from IWC Thane to IWC Bombay.

A very active member, she was the First President of Association of Inner Wheel Clubs in India and Sri Lanka and the first Conference of

Association was held in 1977 in Mumbai when she was Association



President. In 2001 PAP Raksha Mehta was Chairman of Silver Jubilee Celebration Committee of Association of Inner Wheel Clubs in India and also Chairman of the Gujarat Earthquake Relief Committee when Inner Wheel Clubs of the Association took up

projects for physical and social rehabilitation of 9 afflicted villages in Mundra Taluka, Kutch District and also projects for educational scholarship for earthquake affected students.

Since 1997 as Chairman of Rural Projects Committee







of the District -Adopted 40 tribal villages under it and started residential tribal school Shantivan, Panvel, popularly known as Wakdi Project. Till date she is actively involed in the project.

It is because of her untiring service to humanity that she received

Margarette Golding Award in 2006-07.

1977-78 Association President Late Sharada Bhargava (District 312)

Born on 21st January 1929 in a reputed family of Nairobi (Kenya), she acquired her education in Delhi. Her father Late Sri Moolraj Anand was a freedom fighter and was a great Yogacharya. Due to the influence of her father Shardaji as a child also devoted herself to social cause and later became



the member of youth congress too. In 1950 she got married to Rtn. T.N. Bhargava who was the Charter President of Rotary Club of Varanasi South. Mrs. Sharda Bhargava entered the Inner Wheel world in 1965 as a member of I.W.C Banaras, when Inner Wheel District 310 was formed. She became the first Extension Service Organizer. Climbing the district ladder she became the District Secretary in 1970-71 and Founder District Chairman in 1971-72 of District 311. It was in 1973-74 that I.W.C Varanasi South was formed and Mrs.Bhargava became the charter member of I.W.C



Varanasi South. In the year 1976-77 she was elected first as the Vice President of Association of Inner Wheel Clubs in India and Sri Lanka & was crowned as Association President in 1977-78.

It is misfortune that the she didn't live long. In her very short life she visited U.K., U.S.A Europe, Norway, Denmark, Sweden and Canada and achieved a lot



of experience. She started tailoring classes for poor girls and opened first Beauty Parlor in Varanasi. She was classified as a truly International Citizen in International Magazine.

Besides all, these achievements Sharda was known for her impressive personality and friendly nature.

1978-79 Association President Late Prema Ullal (District 318)

An active member of Inner Wheel Club in Bangalore, in 1973-74 she became the District Chairman of then District 318 which is now in District 319). She was also the Constitution and Credentials Committee Chairman for 2nd Triennial Conference held in Bhopal in 1980.

Member of IWC Bhopal, Saroj doned the position of District Chairman twice in two different District. She

was District Chairman of District 306 in the year 1975-76 and of District



304 in 1985-1986 after District 306 bifurcated into 304 and 306.

In her year as President of the Association the Second Triennial Conference was held in Bhopal. Dr. Lalwani was Constitution and Credentials Committee Chairman for 6th Triennial Conference held in Mumbai in 1992. In 1999-2000 she

was Past IIWR's Forum President

Due to her love for writing she prepared and printed a book on practical guidelines for Association, Districts and Clubs on behalf of the Association. It was the first edition.

She held innumerable posts in various social service





organisations other than in Inner Wheel and was also recipient of several prestigious awards- Certificate of Merit from Red Cross by The President of India, Dr. Zakir Hussian; Silver Elephant Highest award in scouting and guiding by The President of India Gyani Zail Singh; Medal of Merit by the Governor of Madhya Pradesh; Mahaveer International Fellow by Mahaveer International; Tittle of Eminent Citizen of India; "Sahitya Shree" by Akhil Bhartiya Sahitya Sammelan; Scroll of Honor "Satalwart of Inner Wheel"; "Sahitya Bhushan" by Akhil Bhartiya Sahitaya Sammelan.

Her love for Inner Wheel was such that in spite of deteriorating health she attended the 13th Triennial Conference in Hyderabad in February 2013 and bid adieu to this world on 24th October 2013.

1980-81 Association President Late Sheila F. Irani (District 318)

Founder President of IWC Mysore, inaugurated on 28th February 1966 (earlier in District 317 (S), now in District 318), Sheila ascended to the level of District Chairman in 1970-71 and enjoyed the post of Association Treasurer in 1977-78 and became Association President in 1980-81. She is the only one from her District to serve as Association President of Inner Wheel Clubs of India and Srilanka. She has been conferred the 'Jean Harris Award' by Rotary International in the year 1999 for



her outstanding contribution to the welfare of women. She was the president of the club.



1981-82 Association President Minna Kapur (District 301)

Born and brought up in Delhi, Minna completed History Honours from Indraprastha University, Delhi and M.A in Hisotry from Miranda House and stood second in the University.

Her achievements in Inner Wheel are neverending. She was instrumental in starting the first Inner Wheel Club of Delhi North in 1968 and was its Founder Secretary and in 1969-70 was club



President. Later she became member of Inner Wheel Club of Delhi. She was elected as District Editor of undivided District 310 and became Founder District Chairman of District 309, when her club came in District 309 in 1977-78 after bifurcation.

As Association President in 1981-82 Mrs. Minna Kapur attended IIW



Convention in Paris, France representing India and Sri Lanka.

After winning the elction for the post of IIW Vice President in 1985-86 she was the First IIW President from India in 1986-87. In 2013-14 she was the recipient of Margarette Golding Award- highest award in IIW.

Earlier she was also the Chairman of PAP Forum.





Her oratory skills are well known not only in Inner Wheel circles but also in Rotary and other organizations. She has addressed many Rotary, Inner Wheel, Rotaract and Interact meetings and has been keynote speakers at many of their events. Many awards and honours have been

- emergence of Association of Inner Wheel Clubs in India with Sri Lanka and Bangladesh as National Governing Bodies.
- Rotary redistricted and thus Inner Wheel too went for redistriction on its will.
- She attended the IIW Convention at Orlando, Florida, USA, where
 - Dr. Mano's brilliant speech on "Communication" which was well received.
 - Dr. Mano carried 273 votes.
 - Indians drew attention for their sarees and jewellery and Indian members dazzled with their talents in music and dance.

Dr. Mrs. Bhaktavatsalam was the Constitution and Credentials Committee Chairman for 5th Triennial Conference held in Vijayawada in 1989.

Dr. Mano is actively involved in Adult Literacy Program. An enviable number of citations and awards have come her way. Her commendable work has been recognized by the Family Planning Association of India, Univerity Women's Association, Lions International District 324 and many other well-known organizations. She has also received the 'Lifetime Achievement Award' from Rotary District 3230. For her dedication to social cause, she was conferred Margarette Golding Award, highest award conferred by IIW in 2013-14.

1987-88 Association President Renu Mehra (District 301)

Member of Delhi South, she was District Chairman of District 309 in 1983-84 (now in Districty 301). In the following year, in 1984-85, she served as Association Secretary and became Association President in 1987-88.





1988-89 Association President Mythri Gandhi (District 315)

A member of Vijayawada Club she became District Chairman 1984-85. During her tenure as Association President 5th Triennial Conference was held in Vijaywada in 1989. She is now a retired member.



1989-90 Association President Anita Aggarwal (District 301)

Anita was born and brought up in Ambala City, Haryana. She graduated from Punjab University and excelled in Table Tennis, debates and sports and represented her college at state level.




1992-93 Association President Dr. Lalita Seth (District 329)

1993-94 Association President Late Leela Rathnam (District 323)

After being District Chairman in 1989-90 she served as Association Secretary in 1990-91 and later in 1993-94 was the Association President. Mrs. Rathnam was Constitution and Credentials Committee Chairman



for 8th Triennial Conference held in Coimbatore in 1998. At present she is not amongst us as she left for heavenly abode.



1994-95 Association President Vimala Abraham (District 321)

A soft-spoken woman, Vimla became District Chairman of her District 321 in 1990-91 and in 1991-92 was the Association Secretary.

During 1994-95 as Association President:

At that point one felt it was the close of a era as this would be the last time that a board member would be representing her country as the structure of the board was being brought down to 16 from 25 as decided at the Sydney Convention. She was the only Past Association President who had the honour of serving as both Past International Inner Wheel Representative and Past International Board Director.

Mrs. Abha Gupta is a multifaceted, dynamic and versatile born leader. Born in a cultured Jain family of Hansi in Haryana, her family shifted to Jaipur. Abha completed her Masters in History. She has a keen flair for sports which is reflected by the fact that she excelled as National Champion of Kho-Kho and State Champion of Hockey. Being a lover of music she sings well too.



Her journey in Inner Wheel started when she joined Inner Wheel Club of Delhi Central as Charter Member in 1977 and ever since has been enthusiastically involved in Inner Wheel.

At club level, being an all-time winner in various competitions, she was declared the Best Secretary, Best President and her club was adjudged the Best Club as Club President in 1985-86.

- Though the National Rep's position came into existence since 1994, but the role of National Rep was defined clearly only in 1995 by the IIW.
- First time the new IIW Board with 16 elected Board



Directors came into existence after the proposal passed in the 9th IIW Convention at Sydney when the Board was reduced from 25 to 16, with name changed from Board Member to Board Director. Also this was the only year when the Association President and Board Director could be the same person. In previous years till 1994, there were Board Members who held that position by virtue of being the National head. There was no election for the Board Member. Only after 1995-96, the election of the Board Director was held. She was privileged to be the first Board Director from India. The meeting of the new structured Board held at Belgium with Ida Dubble dum as the President.

Her uniqueness is that she is the only one from India to be IIW Board Director twice- 1995-96 and 1997-98

Abha Gupta has played a pivotal role in the Triennial Conferences. She was Master of Ceremony at

- Inaugural session at Xth Triennial Conference Pune 2003-04.
- Inaugural Session at XIIth Triennial Conference, Varanasi 2009-10
- Valedictory Session, XIIIth Triennial Conference, Hyderabad 2012-13.

She was Chairman, Constitution and Credentials Committee at XIth Triennial Conference held in Mumbai in 2007. A President of Past Association President (PAP) Forum for 3 years from 2010 to 2013, she was Convener for the Installation of Association Presidents in the year 2004-05





and 2010-11 and has attened 15th International Inner Wheel Convention at Istanbul, Turkey in 2012 as the Voting Delegate.

District 305 has the honour of having Inner Wheel Club of Ahemadabad as the first Inner Wheel Club in India. This club of Ahmedabad was born on 4th February 1955. Late Minne Rustom Camma was the first Presidentof the club. She fiew to Scarborough and brought the charter of this club. From 1955 to 1964 clubs grew to 9 in number. And the first District of India was formed in 1965-66 numbered as District No. 75 with these 9 clubs as founder clubs the District- Ahmedabad, Anand, Bardoli, Bulsar, Nadiad, Navsari, Palanpur, Porbandar, and Surat. The District was formed at Ahmedabad under the guidance of Late Mrs. Dorothy Hitching, the then President of the Association of Inner Wheel Club of Great Britain, Mrs Asma Mascati on Inner Wheel Club of Surat was the first District Chairman of the first IWD in India for the year 1965-66. The District expanded. More and more Inner Wheel Clubs were formed comprising Gujarat, Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh and the district was later on numbered as District 305 in 1968. movement spread by leaps and bounds and in 1968 Dr. Malti Rana from the Navasari became the first IIW representative. Since than our district is doing wonders and bringing laurels.

District 305 was further reorganized into 2 districts- District 305 and District 306. District 306 came into existence in 1970. It included clubs from South Gujarat, Central Gujarat, Saurashtra and Madhya Pradesh. District 306 was again reorganized. The clubs from Madhya Pradesh were included in District 304. Thus the old District 75 in now divided into 3 Districts- Districts 304, 305 and 306.

This district took its birth as District 317 (South) in the old Mysore state with Mrs. Malathi Ramakrishna Rao as the Founder Chairman. In 1974-75 317 (South) got bifurcated into 317 (South) and 317. As the IW movement picked up momentum, its growth necessitated once again bifurcation of the district in 1977. The District 317 (South) was divided into 318 and 319. Thus came into being the present district 318 and history was made. The District 318 today covers eight revenue districts in the southern part of Karnataka namely Chikmagalur, Dakshina Kannada, Hassan, Kodagu, Shimoga, Mysore, Chamarajnagar and Udupi.

5. Brief History of the District

Inner Wheel Club of Trivandrum was the first club in District 320 inaugurated in June 1960, followed by the Inner Wheel Club of Madras South (1963). These Clubs did not belong to any District but belonged to the National Council of Inner Wheel in India. 1966-70 saw the springing up of many clubs in the South. Colombo (1965), Calicut (1966), Madras (1966), Palghat (1968), Quilon (1967), Ranipet (1968), Alleppey (1970), Cochin West (1970), Cannanore (1970), Trichur(1970), Cochin (1971) were formed.

District 320 was the fifth District to be formed in India which was spread over two countries and two states of India. The Inner Wheel District 320 was inaugurated at the District Assembly held at Trivandrum in 1970 by then Association President Dr. Malati Rana. Mrs. Lakshmi N Menon then Central Minister was the Chief Guest of the day. Mrs. Seetha Rajamony of Inner Wheel Club of Trivandrum took over as the first District Chairman, Vice Chairman was Mrs. Jer Nilgiria of Inner Wheel Club of Colombo, and Mrs. Shantha Balakrishnan of Inner Wheel Club of Calicut was the District Secretary.

In July 1974 the District was bifurcated into District 320 and District 321 in tune with the boundaries of Rotary Districts. The District was again bifurcated into District 320 and 323 in 1985 and continues today. The first chairman of the present geographical District 320 is Mrs. Grace Kuruvilla from Cochin.

5. Brief History of the District

- d. Sensory Play Area and Garden: Inner Wheel Club of Trichy has taken up a mega project this year by constructing 'sensory outdoor play area and sensory garden' at the transitional centre for autistic children, 'pravag'.
- e. Lend a goat prgram: Inner Wheel Club of Vakathanam has undertaken a novel project by providing a goat to a poor family. The offspring of that goat will be given to another poor family. Likewise they keep on giving the goats which helps the poor family by selling the milk. The members take care to make sure that these goats are not killed for the purpose of meat.

5. Brief History of the District

The District was a part of District 329. When Rotary Club bifurcated, it was formed in 1992 as District 324. 5. Brief History of the District

Inner Wheel movement started in the eastern zone in the year 1961 with the formation of IWC South West Calcutta under the leadership of founder President Late Mrs. Arati Dutta and founder Secretary Mrs. Roja Bradney. In 1977 District 329 was formed as the 6th independent District under the leadership of Association President Mrs. Raksha Mehta in 1977 with 4 clubs- South West Calcutta, South Calcutta, Darjeeling and Guwahati. Founder District Chairman was Late Mrs. Arati Srimal and District Secretary was Late Mrs. Purnima Choudhury. Bangladesh too was a part of District 329 until in 1984-85 it formed its own National Governing Body. The District later bifurcated in 1992-93 and District 324 were formed.

District has hosted Association Council Meetings several times (1984-85, 199-93, 1996-97).
